

High-Rise Syndrome is the phenomenon of cats falling from higher than two stories, about 23 - 30 feet. This generally occurs from high-risers, but it can also occur in skyscrapers. The term is also used to refer to the injuries sustained by a cat falling from such a height.

Popular myths including the belief that cats can take care of themselves or that they have nine lives seems to have given pet owners the false idea that cats can save themselves from dangerous predicaments. The truth is that cats are as vulnerable to injury as other companion animals and pet owners need to understand how they can prevent their felines from plunging to possible death.
